Hello All!

I would like to get input from as many of you as possible. I will be using the NTHBA forum to gather input – I created a new topic "<u>Education Ideas for 2024</u>" – it should be accessible to all of you if you are logged into the website. But don't worry, if any of you are feeling either too old or too young to be posting on internet message boards the <u>education@nthba.org</u> email is forwarding to me, and you can also let me know your ideas at club meetings.

The input I am looking for is:

Topics

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- What beer and brewing topics interest you right now? Is there a new style everyone should know about, or an old idea to bring back?
- What do you want to learn to improve your brewing?
- What have you learned that you want to teach?
- What do you want to know about other club members' brewing? Would a survey of members equipment or techniques be interesting?

The experience level of club members ranges from new brewers to brewers with decades of experience brewing award winning beer. Many topics can be targeted to a wide range of experience levels, but to target the right levels we need... your input!

Type of educational sessions

Besides newsletter articles, what kind of educational events are you interested in?

- Tasting or sensory demonstrations such as dosing a beer with varying amounts of water salts, or an off-flavors class.
- Guest experts at meetings
- Technique demonstrations at brew days
- Experiments?

And where and when should these events take place? Club meetings, brew days, or at a special session?

Anything Else?

There are whole categories of educational ideas that I haven't thought of, so if you have more ideas please let me know!

A couple fun beer history facts:

- The oldest written beer recipe is Hymn to Ninkasi written in Sumerian 3,900 years ago, but chemical evidence of beer is much older. 7,000 year old pottery with beer residue has been found in Iran, and 5,000 year old pottery with beer residue has been found in both China and Europe.
- Pale lager became popular at the same time glassware became inexpensive enough to replace stoneware mugs. The connection is clear.
