day's events were our Minister of Education Steve Jones and our teacher of the day Don Trotter. Steve gave a very interesting demonstration on wort cooling using various methods. To do this he invested in a hand held data logger along with its own PC based software and a

 temperature probe. With this setup Steve was able to record temperature change data and display graphs for the various cooling schemes. It was really cool and very informative. Those of you that missed it really need to ask Steve about the results. Along with Steve's demonstration was Don Trotter's judging class on Oktoberfest vs. Vienna Lager. Don gave us a very good history of the styles followed by taste comparisons of the two. Oktoberfests abound in the commercial world but Vienna Lagers are hard to find. Thank goodness for Mexico for keeping the style alive with the likes of Negra Modelo and Dos Equis. These two styles are very similar but thanks to Don we were able to see the differences be-



tween the two. Hopefully more of you will make the effort to attend these classes in the future.
